• **DO THIS NOW: <u>"CREATE FSA ID"</u>** - Students who create their FSA ID/StudentAid.gov accounts now will be notified when the application opens in December. After creating their account, it will take up to 3 days for their FSA IDs to be authenticated. While students can technically complete the FAFSA the same day they create their FSA IDs, their IDs will not be authenticated in time, meaning they will have to manually enter their personal information onto the form, making the process longer. Encourage your students and their contributors to create their FSA IDs now to save time and hassle down the road!

KEY INFORMATION:

- HOW TO CREATE FSA ID:
 - Visit <u>Student Aid Website</u> to create an FSA ID
 - o You will need your <u>SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER</u>, <u>FULL NAME</u>, AND <u>DATE OF BIRTH</u>

- You will also need to create a memorable username and password, and complete challenge questions and answers so you can retrieve your account information if you forget it.
- You will be required to provide either your email address or your mobile phone number when you make your FSA ID.
 - Providing a mobile phone number and/or email address that you have access to will make it easier to log in to ED online systems and allow additional account recovery options.
- FSA ID PROCESS FOR CONTRIBUTORS WITHOUT Social Security Number (SSN) NCAN released information last week for contributors (parents) who do not have a social security number. <u>Read</u> more about this process here.
- Important: A Social Security number, email address, and mobile phone number can only be associated with one FSA ID. If you share an email address with someone else, then only one of you will be able to use that email address to create an FSA ID.
