

The scholarship is open to high school seniors entering an institution of higher learning and returning student up to 21 years old continuing their post- secondary education.

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000 to \$10,000

To qualify for a Chicago Urban League scholarship, you must:

- Be a permanent resident of the Chicagoland area
- Possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Demonstrate financial need
- Meet student status requirements for specific awards:
- Enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in a degree-granting program or

- Expect to graduate this year from high school and enroll in a full-time undergraduate degreegranting program or
- Completing a two-year college program and expecting to enroll in a degree-granting program at a four-year institution
- Must be willing to accept an internship or mentorship, if selected
- Must be available to attend the Scholarship Luncheon on June 20, 2024
- Must be available to attend the Trunk celebration activities on June 27, 2024


