
## **BIG MOVES**



#### **BBBSChi Opens Regional Offices Across Chicagoland**

BBBSChi doubled down on its commitment to Chicagoland communities, opening 4 new regional offices to expand our reach in underserved neighborhoods: North Chicago, Merrillville, Auburn Gresham and Homewood. The office openings are a part of BBBSChi's Drive for 5 - a strategic regional expansion plan to provide 5,000 youth across Chicagoland with the lasting impact of a mentor.

We were able to open our doors in these regions thanks to foundational investments from community partners. BBBSChi's Southland office is supported by federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds allocated to the Cook County Department of Public Health. Additionally, funding has been provided in part by the Illinois Department of Human Services to support BBBSChi's Lake County Illinois expansion, including its North Chicago outreach office. Additionally, significant funding for our regional strategy was provided by Senator Durbin via the Federal Community Investment Funds and IL State Senator Javier Cervantes through a grant allocation from the Illinois Department of Human Services.

#### Graduation






