- Conduct quality match support for the participating youth and mentor on a rolling, quarterly schedule to provide coaching, resources, and information to each participant as needed.
- Ensure logistics of school programming, including implementation of curriculum and program schedules in collaboration with school administration
- Monitor program participation and other program metrics to ensure the outcomes of the program are met
- Collaborate with other in school community partners, as appropriate
- Conduct monthly check-ins with school point of contact to ensure program is successful and fully integrates into the school culture and protocols
